Role of the College in Child Protection

Child abuse

- Neglect
- Physical abuse
- Sexual abuse
- Emotional abuse
- Exploitation

Bullying

Bullying is covered under the Colleges' Anti-Bullying Policy and Positive Behavioural Policy.

Self-Harm & Suicidal thoughts
Self-harm is deemed to be any deliberate act by a person which causes harm to themselves. Suicidal thoughts can occur in the absence of actual self-harm.

A full description of the main risk factors can be found in the full Child Protection policy, the Anti-Bullying Policy and the Positive Behaviour Policy.

Reporting a concern
